Dental services and cleanings are available to the community and are an integral part of the hands-on training for our students. The program consists of both classroom and clinical experience incorporating the dental "team concept," which involves four-handed dentistry and expanded dental functions that can legally be delegated to a dental hygienist in Florida. This is a limited enrollment program, and students are admitted once a year with classes beginning in the Summer term. Completion of all or part of the general academic courses required for the degree does not guarantee acceptance into the program. Priority is given to applicants who have completed the most required hours of general education coursework toward the degree by the end of the Fall term preceding the year of application. Graduates will be eligible to take the National Board Dental Hygiene Exam and State Licensing Examinations.
